PBR USA TOURS

The PBR brings the “Toughest Sport on Dirt” to major arenas across the United States with the nationally-televised premier series, featuring the Top 35 bull riders in the world, Real Time Pain Relief Velocity Tour, the league’s expansion tour, and Touring Pro Division, PBR’s developmental tour.

Each event pits the best bull riders in the world against the top bovine athletes on the planet during two hours of heart-pounding, bone-crushing, edge-of-your-seat excitement from the thrills and spills on the dirt to the rock ‘n’ roll music and pyrotechnics of the show. It’s entertainment and world class athleticism rolled into one and unlike any other major-league sport.

PREMIER SERIES

The PBR’s nationally-televised premier series features the world’s Top 35 bull riders going head-to-head against the fiercest bucking bulls on the planet.

In 2018, the series opens at Madison Square Garden in New York City on Jan. 5-7. It concludes in Las Vegas with the PBR World Finals, the richest bull riding event in the world, awarding nearly \$2.2 million in prize money, including the \$1 million bonus to the PBR World Champion, who also receives the coveted \$20,000 gold buckle.

During a regular-season, two-day event on the premier series, each of the 35 riders will ride in one round each day - Round 1 and Round 2. Following Round 2, the riders with the 15 highest two-round total scores will advance to the championship round where they will each ride one more bull. The overall event winner will be the rider with the highest combined score from all three rounds.

For a standard three-day event, each of the 35 riders will ride in one round each day for three days. Following Round 3, the riders with the 15 highest three-round total scores will advance to the championship round where they will each ride one more bull. The overall event winner will be the rider with the highest combined score from all four rounds.

PBR MAJORS

Four events on the premier series are considered PBR Majors – New York City; Arlington, Texas; Las Vegas; and Nashville, Tennessee. These events offer unique formats, bonus bulls, increased prize money and are broadcast on CBS Television Network.

15/15 BUCKING BATTLE

In several markets throughout the season the PBR adds a special round of competition to the premier series events called the 15/15 Bucking Battle. This round features the Top 15 bull riders in the PBR randomly matched against the Top 15 bulls at the event. An additional purse and one-and-a-half times the round points are up for grabs. Although the points do not factor into the specific event’s overall outcome, they do count toward the PBR World Standings.

REAL TIME PAIN RELIEF VELOCITY TOUR

The PBR's Real Time Pain Relief Velocity Tour (RVT) began in 2014 as the premier expansion tour for the PBR, featuring the young, emerging bull riding talent alongside some of the superstars of the sport.

The RVT brings the excitement and talent of the PBR that fans have come to expect from the leader in the sport of bull riding to cities across the U.S. that are not currently included on the premier series' schedule.

The tour is 100% produced and operated by PBR, providing fans the highest quality experience available. In 2018 the RVT will visit approximately 35 cities, including the Real Time Pain Relief Velocity Tour Finals in Las Vegas.

The RVT is the primary and most important qualifying series for bull riders to earn valuable points needed to qualify for the premier series and ultimately the PBR World Finals. Additionally, every winner of a RVT regular-season event will be seeded at one premier series event during the season, providing yet another avenue for the PBR's emerging talent to increase their position in the overall world standings.

The RVT Finals will be featured as the last event of the season, taking place just prior to the PBR World Finals each year. The Top 35 riders from the RVT along with qualifying representatives from PBR's international territories including Australia, Brazil, Canada and Mexico will compete for the final five positions available at the PBR World Finals making it the most important event on the schedule outside of the PBR World Finals itself.



TOURING PRO DIVISION

The Touring Pro Division (TPD) is the developmental tour of the PBR where both established veterans and newcomers to the professional ranks compete against some of the most famous bucking bulls in the sport. The TPD gives riders the opportunity to compete in PBR-sanctioned events while earning points to qualify for the Real Time Pain Relief Velocity Tour and ultimately the league's premier series.

More than 100 TPD events are sanctioned annually by the PBR, awarding almost \$3 million in prize money.

The standard one-day TPD format has 35 competitors; each will ride one bull in Round 1. The Top 10 riders advance to the championship round to compete on one more bull each. The overall event winner is the rider with the highest combined score on two bulls.

Two-day TPD events will take up to 70 competitors with 35 riders competing each day. The Top 10 riders each day advance to the championship round to compete on one more bull each. The overall event winner is the rider with the highest combined score on two bulls.

Based in Townsville, Australia, PBR Australia has been in operation since 2005, operating two competition series, producing approximately 25 sanctioned events annually. Australia native and former bull rider Glen Young is the General Manager overseeing the team. Points earned on all tours counts toward qualification for the PBR Australia Finals. The bull rider with the most points earned at the end of the year, combining those earned from the regular season events and finals, will be crowned as the PBR Australia Champion. The top-ranked Australian rider in the PBR Australia standings as of October 29, 2018 will qualify for the Real Time Pain Relief Velocity Tour Finals where they will be able to compete for a spot at the PBR World Finals.

Brazil has produced eight PBR World Champions, including five of the past 10 with Silvano Alves (2011, 2012 and 2014), Renato Nunes (2010) and Guilherme Marchi (2008). PBR Brazil is led by general director Martha Cajado with the help of Adriano Moraes, a three-time PBR World Champion, serving as Competition Director. The two currently preside over the elite Monster Energy Series, the country's equivalent of the PBR's elite tour in the United States, with 13 tour events planned for 2018. The bull rider with the most points earned at the end of the year will be crowned as the PBR Brazil Champion. The PBR Brazil Champion will qualify for the Real Time Pain Relief Velocity Tour Finals where they will be able to compete for a spot at the PBR World Finals.

THE FINALS

The PBR World Finals is known as the Super Bowl of the PBR. It is a five-day event that marks the end of the PBR season, acknowledges the best rider and bull for the year, and turns one cowboy into a millionaire. The World Finals is the richest bull riding event in the sport, boasting a total purse of \$2.2 million, which includes a \$1 million bonus to the rider who is crowned World Champion.

Each season, for roughly 27 weeks/events on the premier series, and through the Real Time Pain Relief Velocity Tour, Touring Pro Division and PBR's international circuits in Australia, Brazil, Canada and Mexico, the bull riders compete for individual event titles and valuable points needed to qualify for the World Finals and ultimately become World Champion.

For the past 22 years, Las Vegas has been the site of the PBR's season finale, held since 2017 at the state-of-the-art T-Mobile Arena. For five consecutive nights, the world's Top 35 bull riders and the sport's rankest bulls go head-to-head, each competing for World Championship titles and the World Finals event purse.

During Rounds 1-5, held Wednesday-Sunday, riders attempt one bull each. Nightly, round winners are crowned and the riders gain points toward the World Finals event and overall season titles. After Round 5 on Sunday, the scores from the first five rounds are added together to determine the Top 15 bull riders at the event. These riders then compete on one additional bull each. The competitor who finishes the event with the most points wins the event title and \$300,000.

At the end of the World Finals, the points earned for the entire season are added together. The rider who has earned the most points throughout the regular season and the World Finals becomes the World Champion.

Only three times in PBR history has the World Finals event winner and the World Champion been the same rider. In 2004, Mike Lee became the first athlete to accomplish the feat, followed by J.B. Mauney in 2013 and Silvano Alves in 2014.

The World Finals points system was modified in 2004 to ensure that the World Champion was not determined prior to the World Finals. It gave virtually all of the riders in the Top 10 a mathematical chance of becoming the World Champion. A new points system was then instituted in 2015 that made the race for the world title more competitive, and placed further emphasis on the most important achievement in sports – winning.

JESS LOCKWOOD

2017 PBR WORLD CHAMPION

In 2017, capping one of the tightest championship races in league history, 20-year-old phenom Jess Lockwood etched his name in the record books as the youngest World Champion in PBR history.

And his march to the title was nothing short of awe-inspiring, particularly in battling back from a series of serious painful injuries.

Lockwood, the 2016 Rookie of the Year, began his second year, and first full season, on the PBR's premier series on a high note, winning the season opening Major at Madison Square Garden, pocketing \$117,183.33 along with 860 world points. The Montana cowboy soared to the No.1 spot in the world, captured an additional event title at the Frontier Communications Sacramento Clash, and held the top ranking for the first six weeks of the year. Lockwood's domination, however, was put on pause for five weeks after tearing his groin on Feb. 18 at the Iron Cowboy Major in Arlington, Texas.

After returning for the final six events before the premier series' annual summer break, Lockwood was back to his winning ways when the tour resumed in August winning the first event back in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Back on track to challenge for a title, he again experienced a potentially season-derailing injury when knocked unconscious in Springfield, Missouri by World Champion Bull SweetPro's Bruiser just three events after his Oklahoma win.

Despite being carried out of the arena on a backboard, the tough-as-nails, five-foot-five, former high school wrestler returned to competition the following weekend in Austin, Texas, winning the event title, backed by two 90-point rides.

But that wasn't the last time Lockwood would need to overcome the odds en route to winning the first gold buckle of his young career.

At the next event in Uniondale, New York, Lockwood suffered four broken ribs, a punctured lung and lacerated kidney after being stomped by his Round 1 draw, Blue Magic. After spending 30 hours in a Long Island hospital, Lockwood, who was not cleared to fly, was forced to be driven cross-country to his family in North Dakota by fellow rider Stetson Lawrence. Further complicating matters, Lockwood came down with pneumonia during the 1,600-plus mile trek.

Just two events later, Lockwood made his second return of the season, two weeks premature.

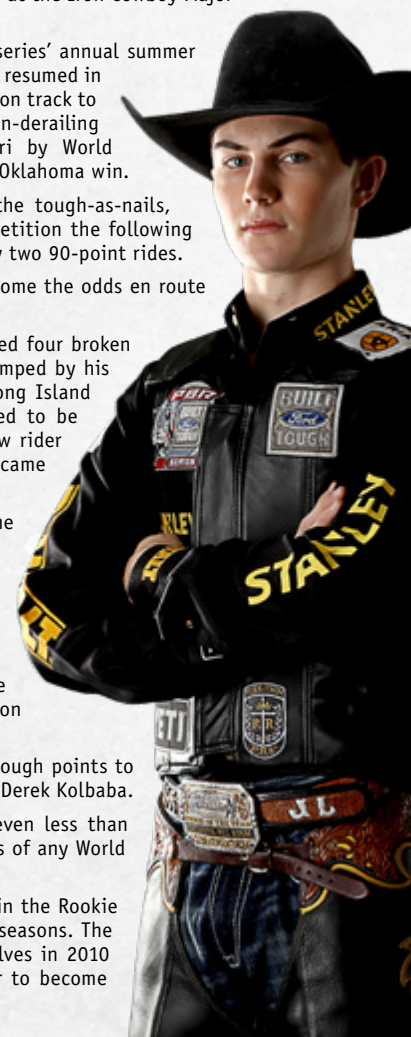
Entering the World Finals, Lockwood faced an event he was shut out at in his first appearance, going 0-for-5 in 2016.

However, the seemingly unstoppable rider was electric, winning the first three rounds of the event, a PBR record; two of which came via 90-point rides. Lockwood reclaimed the world No. 1 ranking for the first time since Week 6 of the season following his Round 2 victory.

He concluded the five-day, six-round event third, earning enough points to capture the world title, finishing 447.5 points ahead of No. 2 Derek Kolbaba.

Riding at just 20 elite series events during the season, seven less than runner-up Kolbaba, Lockwood competed at the fewest events of any World Champion since at least 1999.

Lockwood also became just the second rider in history to win the Rookie of the Year honor and World Champion title in back-to-back seasons. The only other rider to have accomplished the feat is Silvano Alves in 2010 and 2011. Further, he is just the fourth Rookie of the Year to become World Champion.

JOSE VITOR LEME

2017 WORLD FINALS EVENT WINNER / 2017 ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

When Jose Vitor Leme arrived in the United States in late October he'd never been on a plane nor left his home country of Brazil. Eight days following the start of his 4,500-mile trek, he'd make history in the PBR – riding every single bull at the World Finals, winning the most prestigious event in pro bull riding, and creating big expectations for the 2018 season.

As the 2017 PBR Brazil Champion, Leme, 21, was one of five international invitees to the 2017 Real Time Pain Relief Velocity Tour (RVT) Finals. In his first season competing at PBR Brazil events, the rookie rider took Brazil by storm en route to capturing the national title, riding to three wins, including the PBR Brazil Finals, in addition to seven Top 5 finishes at the 11 events he entered, which also earned him 2017 PBR Brazil Rookie of the Year honors.

His success only snowballed once he was stateside.

After going 3-for-4 at the RVT finals, finishing eighth, Leme received a berth to the elite PBR World Finals as the top finishing international invite.

On the sport's biggest stage, the young gun was perfect, going 6-for-6, to capture both the World Finals event title, \$300,000 bonus, and Rookie of the Year honors. Leme is just the fifth rider in PBR history since 2000 to be perfect at the World Finals, and fifth Rookie of the Year to capture the World Finals event title.

His performance inside T-Mobile Arena, while electric from start to finish, was punctuated by his 94.5-point trip aboard Magic Train in the Championship Round, earning him the Lane Frost/Brent Thurman Award for the high-marked ride of the event. Of all 90-point rides throughout the 2017 PBR season, the score was second only to Stormy Wing's 95.25-point trip aboard World Champion bull SweetPro's Bruiser in March.

Adding to the astonishing nature of his feat in Las Vegas was that of his six qualified rides at the top level of the PBR, three earned him a score of 90 points or more. When compared to two-time World Champion J.B. Mauney, it took the North Carolinian bull riding legend eight months on the premier series to score his first 90-point ride.

By earning 2532.5 world points compliments of his showing at the World Finals, Leme was catapulted to the top of the Rookie of the Year standings, becoming the first rider in history to win the title when the only elite series event attended was the World Finals.

After beginning the 24th annual World Finals No. 53 in the world, he finished 2017 as the world's No. 7 ranked rider.

SWEETPRO'S BRUISER

2017 PBR YETI WORLD CHAMPION BULL

After a season-long battle for supremacy with Pearl Harbor, SweetPro's Bruiser repeated as the YETI World Champion Bull in 2017, a feat only three other bovine athletes have accomplished in PBR history.

Bruiser joins three-time World Champion Bulls Bushwacker (2011, 2013 & 2014) and Little Yellow Jacket (2002, 2003 & 2004) along with two-time champion Dillinger (2000 & 2001) to successfully repeat.

He also made history in becoming just the second bull to win both the PBR YETI World Champion Bull and PRCA Bull of the Year honors in the same season, joining 1995 World Champion Bodacious.

The D&H Cattle Company bovine athlete won the title with a total two-out bull score of 93 points, including his 47-point score for dispatching Emilio Resende at the 1.91-second mark, earning him the YETI Bull of the Finals honor and an additional \$25,000.

He is the 16th different YETI World Champion Bull in PBR history.

Bruiser concluded the season with a 12-4 record and a career-high 46.02 average bull score. He was marked 45 points or higher in all 16 of his outs, including a career-high 47.25-point score for bucking off 2017 World Champion Jess Lockwood in Springfield, Missouri.

Bruiser has been ridden only nine times in his career by five different riders (J.B. Mauney, Joao Ricardo Vieira, Mason Lowe, Derek Kolbaba and Stormy Wing) in 46 premier series outs over the course of his four-year career. Those five riders have won over \$1.5 million on the back of Bruiser, which includes Mauney's \$1 million World Champion bonus for his world title-clinching 92.75-point ride on Bruiser at the 2015 PBR World Finals.

2017 PBR WORLD FINALS AWARDS

PBR WORLD CHAMPION JESS LOCKWOOD

The rider who earns the most PBR world points during the regular season and five-day World Finals.

PBR WORLD FINALS EVENT WINNER JOSE VITOR LEME

The winner is the rider who has earned the most PBR world points at World Finals.

PBR ROOKIE OF THE YEAR JOSE VITOR LEME

The first-year rider on the premier series who accumulates the most PBR world points throughout the regular-season and PBR World Finals.

STOCK CONTRACTOR OF THE YEAR CHAD BERGER

The winner is determined by a vote of the Top 35 bull riders on the premier series.

PBR YETI WORLD CHAMPION BULL SWEETPRO'S BRUISE [D&H CATTLE CO.]

Candidates for the title are determined by a vote of the Top 35 bull riders on the premier series. The winner is the bull with the highest average bull score across their Top 8 outs during the regular season and two outs at World Finals.

YETI BULL OF THE FINALS SWEETPRO'S BRUISER [D&H CATTLE CO.]

The winner is the bull that earns the highest total bull score across two outs at the World Finals.

GLEN KEELEY AWARD DAKOTA BUTTAR
